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OVERVIEW



The Governor's School for Entrepreneurs (GSE) was founded in 2013. GSE is a 3-week accelerator-styled summer program for Kentucky teens. GSE's experiential program exposes participants to a broad range of resources, tools, and people that will not only help them understand business, but help them see the world through the lens of an entrepreneur. During the program, teams develop a business model, design and build a prototype, and pitch their startup to a large audience and panel of judges. Teens learn about the opportunities, benefits and pitfalls of taking a business concept from the idea phase to pitching it to potential investors. Through learning the difficulties of building a company, participants not only grow to understand what it takes to start a company, but what it means to be a great employee.

GSE is a program of the Kentucky Entrepreneurship Education Network, Inc or KEENStart for short. KEENStart is a registered 501(c)(3) non-profit. GSE is an agency of the Kentucky Education and Workforce Development Cabinet.



VISION & MISSION

VISION

GSE's leadership recognized that teens in Kentucky were not being given dynamic opportunities to learn about entrepreneurship and put their ideas into action. For many communities in Kentucky, efforts focused on human capital -- meaning entrepreneurship education initiatives aimed at changing the mindset and capacity of young people -- may be the best hope of changing outcomes and improving living

standards.

MISSION

KEENStart is nurturing and growing th entrepreneurial ecosystem of Kentucky by giving teens an authentic glimpse into the mind of an entrepreneur. Our programs inspire and inform the next generation of innovators by providing a challenging setting where failure is not only accepted, but encouraged.

Participants are pushed beyond their self-conceived limits and are forced to understand that failure is not be feared. Developing an entrepreneurial mindset is the first step to a bright future.

GSE entrepreneurs live on a college campus in dormitories with separate quarters for males and females. During the transformational 3-week period, they learn a great deal about themselves and others as they live in a community and develop long-lasting friendships. A select group of trained high school and college educators, graduate and undergraduate students, business leaders, experienced entrepreneurs and other mentors works closely with the teens in experiential learning sessions, hands-on design sessions and cross-curricular activities. Well - known guest speakers and mentors, field trips to startup companies and other businesses, interactive technology workshops, special events, and a wide range of recreational opportunities offer an array of stimulating activities.

A MESSAGE FROM THE DIRECTOR

To our many Friends and Supporters,

As a child, I went through a period where I was fascinated with space. One year, I received a telescope for my birthday and became hooked. I spent hours staring at the same night sky I had seen countless times before. One night, after scanning the craters of the moon until I could see spots, something new emerged. I finally discovered the "man on the moon" I had heard so much about. He was always in front of me, but that night, my perception had changed.

I looked at the moon through a lens that enabled me to discover something new. I believe life has many of these moments that fundamentally change the way we view the world (or space, in my case). These experiences provide insight into new ideas and perspectives.

I encountered another one of these moments in college when two friends and I decided to start a company. Young, eager, and broke we figured we had little to lose. We ended up making it further than expected, but after a few years we decided to close our doors. Initially, it felt like a failure, and we walked away with disappointment.

But as we moved forward in our respective careers, we began to realize that something was different. We were able to look at the world through a new lens, crafted by the teachings of entrepreneurship we had acquired over the years. Failure on some level is inevitable, but from our experience we gained a new outlook not reflected in our bottom line. I'd gained a truer sense of self, became acutely aware of my strengths and weaknesses, and learned the undeniable importance of self-determination.

THE GSE EXPERIENCE

At GSE, we aim to create an authentic entrepreneurial experience for teen participants. Entrepreneurship is messy and often unpredictable - therefore our design directly mirrors these concepts. Finding clarity in ambiguity and embracing failure as a positive on the pathway to success lines all that we do at GSE. The soft skills we activate, paired with our innovative curriculum, ensure growth in each and every GSE entrepreneur.

GSE has a competitive application process that consists of three parts and can be viewed in the graphic to the left. During the application review process, GPA and standardized test scores are not considered. Some of the world's greatest entrepreneurs were not the best students. What we care about is difficult to quantify. We seek the innovative thinkers, the collaborators, and the ones with a drive that is undeniable.

PROGRAM CONTENT

The Lean Startup

Championed by Eric Ries, the Lean Startup is a business development methodology based on the lean manufacturing philosophy used by Toyota. Focused on a build-measure-learn process, the lean startup methodology provides a framework to help entrepreneurs build companies cheaper and more effectively.

Business Model Canvas

Originated by Alexander
Osterwalder, the Business Model
Canvas (BMC) is a template used to
show a company's business model.
The BMC breaks a company down
into nine parts and helps GSE
participants understand different
aspects of a business and how they
relate.

Design Thinking

Design thinking is an approach to creative problem-solving. This way of thinking forces teams or individuals to empathize with human needs and look at new ways of solving problems. Design thinking lies at the center of desirability, feasibility, and viability.

ENTREPRENEURIAL SKILLS

In learning entrepreneurial skills, a mindset change takes place. Learning to think like an entrepreneur empowers young people to dissect their reality, see how it fits together, and imagine a new ways of reconstruction.

GSE unlocks the innate entrepreneurial spirit inside teens. They already want to be creative and innovative, GSE just helps them understand how to do it. Our experience helps them realize their self-worth, gives them the motivation to take initiative, and teaches that flexibility is necessary because failure is unavoidable.

The team environment helps participants understand the importance of collaboration and communication. They learn the power of networking and what it means to be a good employee. Entrepreneurial skills go beyond a summer program, business or classroom; entrepreneurial skills are life skills.

2017 PROGRAM HIGHLIGHTS

GSE was founded in 2013 as a 3-week summer program for Kentucky 9th, 10th, and 11th grade teens. In 2017, GSE moved to Transylvania University. This change was one of many. Constant innovation is necessary for every company, GSE is no exception. GSE will continue to grow and modify our offerings based on the needs of teen entrepreneurs.



From the first day of GSE, our young entrepreneurs are challenged. Often, they come expecting worksheets and a traditional educational experience. What they receive is exactly the opposite. Our entrepreneurs create their own work, guided by their own ideas and understandings. We guide them using tools and skills we know to be crucial for success. We expose them to the content, and they implement. It is truly amazing to see the transformation of our teens from day 1 of our program, to day 21. From the beginning, we demand that they think on their feet, embrace failure, and ask questions. We simulate what it takes to create a company, to build a solid foundation from concept to reality. There are no right or wrong answers, no yes or no questions. Entrepreneurial skills are life skills - and by the end of our program, we ignite an entrepreneurial mindset that our participants carry with them for the rest of their lives.

In 2017, GSE turned our private pitch event into a public event, called Demo Day. For our inaugural event, over 200 attendees witnessed the transformation of our young entrepreneurs. Our entrepreneurs effectively and professionally pitched their business ideas, showcasing their sharpened public speaking skills.



49% of 2017 GSE Entrepreneurs were female.


60 Participants from 27 different counties

27% represented a racial minority


25% represented a low-socioeconomic status

THE STATE OF ENTREPRENEURSHIP




As reported by the Kaufmann Foundation and the Brookings Institution, the number of new companies in the U.S. has dropped 44% since 1978. At GSE we're working to reverse these numbers by activating the spirit of entrepreneurship in Kentucky teens.



We need to inspire more young people to be active and engage in entrepreneurship. Entrepreneurship certainly isn't for everyone, but teens need to be exposed to authentic entrepreneurial programs and courses in order to make that decision for themselves. The graph above shows a 9% decline in entrepreneurs ages 20-34 from 1997 to 2016.

WHAT'S NEXT FOR KEENSTART?



From 9th Grader to Business Owner

- 1. GSE will grow from 3 to 4 weeks, with a maximum of 72 talented participants. GSE will also begin training KY educators, offering them an authentic entrepreneurial curriculum specifically designed for teens. The Entrepreneurial Educators training program (E²) is designed to feed KY's entrepreneurial ecosystem and will be integrated into the overall GSE experience.
- 2.GSE is developing an alumni portal that will facilitate and curate Kentucky's teen entrepreneurial talent. This portal will encourage continued entrepreneurial engagement and development while offering a new way for sponsors and others to interact with our teen talent. This new addition will ensure that entrepreneurial talent is continually funneled into KY's entrepreneurial ecosystem.
- 3. Working alongside several existing business growth entities throughout the state, we will create a statewide network of teen entrepreneurial engagement. Using our entrepreneurial educators, teens will continue to be immersed in entrepreneurship in their home communities.
- 4. Through GSE, the alumni portal, and our statewide network, we will work to identify the most promising teen entrepreneurs each year. These entrepreneurs will be invited to join an intensive program comprised of mentorship, funding, office space, and additional tools.
