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# ABOUT GSE

### WHAT IS GSE?

A 3-week residential summer program where creative, free-thinking teens are empowered to share and develop their ideas for innovative products and services in an exploratory learning environment.

### WHAT IS AN E?

At GSE we put an emphasis on the "E".

Participants are not just students and teens, they are aspiring entrepreneurs. 'Entrepreneur' is a mouthful to say, so we shorten it to E.

### WHAT Es DO

Every day at GSE the Es are engaged in lean startup methodology. Student entrepreneurs learn by doing, through the framework of business model design, customer development and agile engineering. GSE Es see problems as challenges to overcome. Applying STEM skills and design thinking, they design and build a prototype of their product or service. Working in small business teams, Es learn the components of a business model. Emphasis is on the triple bottom line – caring about profitability, social equity and environmental conservation.

### PERFORMANCE-BASED CREDIT

Depending on school district policy, GSE satisfies performance-based entrepreneurship credit as a business education elective. Students who complete GSE's three-week residential program will put in a minimum of 135 hours of learning time comprised of direct instruction, applied learning, guest speakers, professional mentors and field trips. The session culminates with the teams giving an oral business pitch presentation to a panel of business owners, investors and professionals. All this means GSE alumni are college and career ready.

### **BADGES**

Students who demonstrate high achievement are awarded badges.















# PRESENTATION DAY

On the last day of GSE, 14 student business teams gave pitches to a panel of outside judges. On the panel were entrepreneurs, investors and business development professionals.

The five top scoring GSE teams gave their pitches to the Lexington Venture Club. Two teams took home cash prizes totaling \$1000. At least 4 teams have been continuing their venture after GSE.

MotoMill pitched in Northern Kentucky's Innovation Network pitch competition and to the Central Kentucky Inventors Council.

**ViviCharge** won \$750 from the Lexington Venture Club.

Mizo is developing a sophisticated app for persons with nut allergies.

Fidem Aurem won \$250 from the Lexington Venture Club.

# WHAT ARE GSE ALUM DOING?

20 seniors from the **GSE2013** class graduated high school in 2014.

- 14 are attending college, including leading universities both instate and out-of-state.
- 6 are involved with their own ventures. One such venture, Aberrance Quarterly, has gained national attention from the Huffington Post.
- Average ACT score 26;

   national average 21
- Average GPA at graduation 3.74;
   KY statewide average 3.0
- Aggregate value of scholarships received \$457,450 (over 4 years)





- "Coming into GSE I was thinking, "Why am I giving three weeks of my summer up to do this? I could be at parties, or spending time with friends, but no I'm at a college." Three weeks later and I look back and think how dumb that was. These have been some of the best times of my life."
- "Do not be scared to speak up your idea."
- "Follow through!!!!! It's okay to pivot."
- "Absolutely DO NOT be afraid to come out of your comfort zone."
- "Learn to work well with people. If you don't get along with someone, really take the time to get to know them and understand them."
- "Don't say you can't do anything."
- "Be ready to work! It's a great experience and you learn a lot, but they leave everything up to you, so your product's success is solely your responsibility."
- "Work with your group so they will work."
- "Think big and be willing to listen."
- "Be open about ideas. Don't offend anyone's ideas. Always have fun!"
